

## **INTERTOLL AFRICA AWARDED THE N3 MOTORWAY - MARIANHILL TOLL PLAZA CONTRACT**

On 5<sup>th</sup> February 2016, Intertoll Africa, a fully-integrated South African based road management, toll systems developer and tolling company with existing operations across Africa, was awarded the Comprehensive Toll Road Operation and Maintenance (CTROM) contract by SANRAL for the Operation and Maintenance of the Mariannahill Toll Plaza facility on the N3 Route for a period of 5 years, commencing on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2016, with the possibility of an extension of another 3 years.

This facility is situated near the port city of Durban in the province of KwaZulu-Natal in South Africa. The official toll road is 19km in length and the toll plaza consists of 16 lanes in a mainline configuration only. All lanes have been equipped to accept Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) transactions. The Average Daily Traffic (ADT) varies between 35,000 vehicles on "normal" days and 55,000 vehicles during peak holiday seasons – therefore considered the toll plaza with the largest throughput in South Africa.

The contract awarded to Intertoll by SANRAL includes the following works and services:

### **Operations:**

- Collection and control of Toll at the Toll Plaza,
- Traffic management, and
- Financial management.

### **Supply of Toll Equipment**

The works include the replacement of the existing toll system with the Intertoll-designed, developed, and manufactured toll system. These systems have already been supplied to the N4 West Magalies contract situated near Pretoria on the route to Hartebeesport Dam.

### **Maintenance Services**

These include the maintenance of all the SANRAL supplied facilities, assets, including the electrical and mechanical equipment, including the maintenance and support of the toll collection system.



Traffic consists on average of 24% heavy goods vehicles and 76% light vehicles and the Toll Plaza is a welcome addition to the 4 other plazas operated by Intertoll on the N2 North highway.
